The Brisbane Cricket Ground, commonly known as The Gabba, is a major sports stadium in Brisbane.

The Gabba is an icon of the Brisbane landscape and is the home ground for the Brisbane Lions AFL team and the Queensland Bulls state cricket team. The 42,000 seat stadium boasts unrestricted views of the oval playing surface from all areas making it ideal to host international sporting and entertainment events.

The QGFHA can confirm that the lights will be turned on during the dinner enabling players and support staff to enjoy this unique venue.
